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ECSA Nutrient Workshop in Plymouth (UK), 26-28 June 2012

ECSA Nutrients Workshop

Plymouth University, 26-28th June 2012

This hands-on workshop will focus on methods for the determination of the macronutrients nitrogen (N) and phosphorus (P). Attendees will have the opportunity to learn about, and discuss, quality issues pertaining to N and P analysis in water samples before embarking on a series of practical sessions. There will be an opportunity to get hand-on experience with techniques for the determination of N and P species in water samples: namely spectrophotometry using a segmented flow analyser (nitrate and phosphate), fluorimetry (ammonium), high temperature catalytic combustion (organic nitrogen). In addition, the application of flow injection techniques will be

introduced to present attendees with ideas for building their own system for nutrient determinations.

The course will include lectures on analytical quality control and the cycling of N and P in aquatic systems and there will be ample opportunity for discussion, data analysis and interpretation, and networking.

The fee for this 3-day course will be £450 (£420 for ECSA members), which includes pre-course materials, daily refreshments and lunch, and a workshop dinner on the 27th June.

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ECSA51 in Klaipeda (Lithuania), 23-27 September 2012



Research & management of transitional waters

ECSA 51th International Symposium
Klaipeda, Lithuania, September 23–27, 2012

The ECSA51 international symposium will be co-organized by the Coastal Research & Planning Institute of the Klaipėda University, BALLOON (Baltic Lagoon research Network) and EUROMEDFED (Euro-Mediterranean federation of coastal lagoons and transitional water bodies)

Venue: Campus of the Klaipeda University, H. Manto 84, Klaipeda, Lithuania

The term “transitional waters” are defined as “bodies of surface water in the vicinity of river mouths which are partially saline in character as a result of their proximity to coastal waters but which are substantially influenced by freshwater flows”. These areas are considered diverse, highly productive, ecologically important systems on a global scale and highly valuable for the services they provide to human societies since at least the Neolithic times. The aim of this symposium is to get to the bleeding point of interdisciplinary scientific research carried out and to get the contemporarily insight on the conservation, restoration and management problems in these systems.

The involvement in the organization of conference of both Baltic (BALLOON) and European and Mediterranean (EUROMEDFED) lagoon research networks brings a special focus to the European lagoons. The conference is also proud to receive support from the South Baltic Programme “ARTWEI” project dealing with the transboundary aspects of lagoon and transitional waters management in the Baltic.

Selected conference presentations are expected to be published in “Estuarine Coastal and Shelf Science” and “Transitional Waters Bulletin” journals.

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Senior Fisheries Ecologist @ Charles Darwin Foundation, Galapagos Islands, Ecuador

Vacante/Vacancy: Ecologo Pesquero Senior / Senior Fisheries Ecologist

The Charles Darwin Foundation in the Galapagos Islands, Ecuador is seeking an individual experienced in fisheries research and sustainable management. This is a full time position based in Puerto Ayora, Santa Cruz Island, Galapagos. Fluency in Spanish and English as well as excellent interpersonal skills are required.

A full job description is provided below:

TERMS OF REFERENCE

1. General information

Position title: Senior Fisheries Ecologist (ECP-2012)

Supervised by: Station Director / Marine Science Program Coordinator

Supervises: Junior investigators, volunteers and students

Location: Puerto Ayora, Galapagos Islands, Ecuador

2. Summary

The Senior Fisheries Ecologist will lead the fisheries investigation of the Charles Darwin Foundation (CDF) in the Galapagos Marine Reserve (GMR). He/she will report and interact with the Marine Science Program Coordinator; he/she will supervise biologists and technicians involved in the fisheries evaluation, stock assessment and fisheries biology. The Senior Fisheries Ecologist will also represent the CDF in technical fisheries commissions, such as the participatory management board (PMB) directly linked with the Galapagos National Park (GNP) in all fisheries related topics.

3. Main responsibilities

- Lead and carry out research on fisheries assessment, population dynamics and ecology of benthic and pelagic marine resources of the Galapagos archipelago and coordinate activities with collaborating scientists and local stakeholders (fishers, GNP, NGO's, government).
- Lead the elaboration of technical reports for the GNP and various donors in coordination with the Marine Science Program Coordinator and the head of marine resources at the GNP

- Collaborate in the development of new research methods and experimental design for projects focusing on population dynamics, ecology as well as reproductive and larval biology of marine resources (as long as there is sufficient funding available)
- Analyze and collaborate in the analysis of fisheries data focusing in particular on sustainable fisheries production models (MSY and virtual population analyses)
- Write and coordinate the elaboration of scientific publications for peer-reviewed journals and institutional publications.
- Maintain a close collaboration with the head of marine resources in the GNP and the local stakeholders of the GMR facilitating participatory research.
- Provide technical advice on conservation and management of marine resources to the institutions, decision makers and stakeholders of the GMR. Attend meetings of the Participatory Management Board (PMB) and/or inter-institutional management authority (IMA), and present research results when appropriate.
- Give and support the organization of lectures, courses, seminars and workshops to train CDF staff, the department of marine resources of the GNP and other stakeholders of the GMR.
- Supervise staff assigned to fisheries research related topics (junior scientists, students and volunteers) ensuring their professional and intellectual development.
- Collaborate in coordination with the Marine Science Program Coordinator with visiting scientists carrying out projects in the Galapagos Islands.
- Ensure the efficient administration of activities under his/her responsibility, complying with all procedures, regulations and deadlines of the CDF and respective donors.
- In coordination with the Marine Science Program Coordinator generate research proposals to ensure further funding. Participate in activities that aim to promote the institution, strengthen and build up relationships with current and potential donors e.g. through presentation, interviews and attending VIP visitors in the CDF.

4. Profile and requirements

- ☑ Professional with a M.Sc. or Ph.D. in biological sciences, ecology, marine or fisheries sciences.
- ☑ A minimum of three years experience as a fisheries biologist.
- ☑ Knowledge of standard fisheries evaluation methodologies and software.
- ☑ Knowledge of database management and statistical analysis.
- ☑ Proven experience in the development of scientific and technical reports, in particular in writing documents destined for a general audience (for example, audiovisual presentations and newsletters).
- ☑ Experience in the development of research projects, fundraising and communication with donors.
- ☑ Experience in conservation of marine protected areas and in the sustainable management of marine resources with the aim of improving and optimizing traditional fishing techniques.
- ☑ Excellent command of Spanish and English.
- ☑ Excellent interpersonal skills

Other attributes

- ☑ The candidate must be capable of easily adapting to a multidisciplinary and multicultural team and be able to maintain good relations with a variety of individuals involved in the different area of fisheries.
- ☑ He/she must have an ability to work in a dynamic environment that presents unexpected opportunities and challenges, characterized by often limited logistic resources and geographical isolation.
- ☑ A clear interest and commitment in conservation.

Terms and conditions of contract

This is a long-term position with the CDF. The duration of the term is initially for one year, but there is a possibility for contract renewal subject to funding availability and the candidate's performance. The position is based in Puerto Ayora, Santa Cruz Island, Galapagos. A monthly salary

will be paid according to candidate qualifications. Benefits include private medical insurance and 30 calendar days holiday per annum.

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PhD and postdoctoral positions @ IES (JRC), Italy

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Research Assistant Position on Nephrops @ CEMS, University of Hull, UK

Fisheries landings of *Nephrops norvegicus* (also known as Dublin bay prawn, Norway lobster and langoustine) are around 59,000 tons a year with a first sale value of around Euro 200 million, making it the most valuable crustacean fishery in Europe. The fishery is currently dominated by trawling with a small fraction of catch taken using pots (creels). There is little scope to expand trawling fisheries for *Nephrops* and given the direction of the proposed new Common Fisheries Policy, it seems likely that small scale, inshore potting fisheries will be favoured. To support the development of sustainable inshore fisheries the FP7 project "Nephrops" will be developing hatchery techniques and technology and ways to enhance the survival of discards.

As part of this project the Centre for Environmental and Marine Sciences (CEMS), University of Hull (Scarborough Campus), seeks to offer a 3-year research assistant position. The successful applicant will be expected to register for a PhD. It is envisaged that the post will be based at the Orkney Fishermen's Association lobster hatchery in Orkney during the summer season and in CEMS during the winter. The research assistant will be tasked with developing hatchery techniques suitable for *Nephrops* and trialling technology to enhance the survival of creel caught and trawl caught discards.

The ideal candidate will have a 1st class degree and/or MSc in marine biology/ecology and be able to demonstrate interests in e.g. hatchery technology/techniques, aquarium management, crustacean biology, animal behaviour or fisheries ecology. An interest and certification in SCUBA diving (including an HSE medical) to CMAS*** and experience on small boats would be advantageous. It is expected that the successful candidate would have a full driving licence. The field work for this position will be in a beautiful but remote and rural community. Candidates that require the comforts and convenience of city life should not apply. Full training will be given to the successful candidate both in terms of academic supervision from CEMS and hands on support at the hatchery.
