Subject: Secretary's report 2009

Estuarine and Coastal Sciences Association Secretary's Report 2009

The previous year's Report (2008) brought the members'attention to the attempts of the Association to consolidate the changes of the past few years.

In particular there were a number of areas of concern, focussing around the seemingly continued decline in membership. While the new website would help raise the Association's profile, it seemed to be proving difficult to attract the next generation of estuarine scientists into ECSA, and more importantly to retain these recruits and involve them in the committees and organisation. One of the mechanisms to address this situation is obviously the use of the Symposia to attract recruits, and Council did emphasise the advantage, necessity almost, of building ECSA membership into Symposia registration. Council has also looked to broaden the membership base, and has been very active in promoting Symposia venues outside the UK. This has worked very well, in that not only have these been successful meetings in their own right, but also we have been able to recruit new Council members as a result of these meetings.

The Association has continued to be in demand for meetings. We have offers for some years to come, and these offers come from Ireland (2009), Germany (2010), Portugal (2010), South Africa (2011), Lithuania (2011) and China (2012), with local meetings planned in France, Netherlands and Germany as well as the UK. Again, what is gratifying has been the range of delegates to these meetings, which, as remarked above, provide us with an excellent opportunity to promote the Association internationally.

ECSA has continued to review the range of services it offers to members. The bulk of these efforts have been directed towards the website, with for example a section on 'Jobs and PhD opportunities' and official thanks to the webmaster Shona Thompson for her efforts. In addition, the second electronic newsletter was

sent out in November 2008, thanks to the efforts of Anita Franco, and the Association would like some feedback from members on this form of communication. In particular, ECSA would like to know whether this electronic version should supplant or merely reinforce the *Bulletin* in hard copy. Thanks to the Editor, Colin Taylor, and as usual, a plea for articles and copy to both Colin and Anita.

The revival of the estuarine Handbooks is proceeding rather more slowly than at first hoped, but still with prospects of their re-issue. The Elsevier Treatise is well under way with a major input from ECSA members including the Commissioning Editor, Donald McLusky. Donald has served as Editor of ECSS for many years, and has been instrumental in raising the profile of the journal and improving its citation index. This year he announced his intention to step down from this post and ECSA has nominated a successor to Elsevier. Their response is awaited.

ECSA continues to explore avenues of closer cooperation with its sister organisation in the USA (ERF, now CERF), and Council has been grateful to the efforts of 'Si' Simenstad in this regard. The Association is also grateful to the contributions of all its Councillors, especially those outside its traditional UK base, to promote ECSA and to keep expanding in terms both of membership and geographical representation. Particular thanks to our retiring President, Mike Elliott, who has been a vigorous supporter and promoter of ECSA as Council member, as Bulletin Editor, as Secretary and of course as President.

Finally, as Secretary, I would like to thank personally all the members of ECSA Council for their support over 2008-9 and look forward to their continuing support in 2009-10.

ASLO-NABS 2010 Meeting Global Changes from the Center to the Edge June 6-11, 2010 Santa Fe, New Mexico, USA

On June 6, 2010, aquatic scientists of many nationalities from two major scientific societies, ASLO & NABS, will rendezvous on Santa Fe, New Mexico to share and discuss their latest findings. The global water resources these scientists study face inordinate challenges. The year 2010 marks the 400<sup>th</sup> Commemoration of Santa Fe as a capital and cultural center. During these past four centuries, a limited supply of water has been a precious hydrological lifeline in this area of the US. The 2010 ASLO-NABS meeting's theme, Global Changes from the Center to the Edge, draws attention to the entirety of aquatic systems on which humans depend. Lakes and ponds have centers that respond to influences from the nearshore and the watershed, as do oceans. Science, too, has centers of scholarship and associated interdisciplinary activities. This meeting will explore these and other centers and edges, encompassing and embracing the entire hydrological cycle and drawing strength from the synergy to be found between the North American Benthological Society and the American Society of Limnology and Oceanography.

Bringing these two societies together in a joint meeting shines light on many types of connections, whether they be thematic or interdisciplinary. It is an efficient and effective means for both memberships to hear the latest scientific findings and results. The conference layout and schedule will fully integrate the best of the typical meetings of both societies, as well as offer a unique setting in Santa Fe. This marine science meeting will provide diverse opportunities for strong international interaction with emphasis on freshwater topics.

The Planning Committee invites proposals from all interested scientists in the aquatic sciences and leaders of major programs in this area for special sessions of interest to this joint conference. This meeting, emphasizing Global Changes from the Center to the Edge, is an important venue for scientific exchange across broad aquatic science disciplines, including physical, biological, chemical, and geological aspects, all branches of limnology, hydrology, and multidisciplinary topics ranging from evolution to climate change. We also welcome proposals for sessions on subjects that reflect new and ongoing research on watersheds, water resources, and society, including science education, outreach, and public policy.

Proposals for special sessions are due 30 September 2009. Proposals should identify at least two co-chairs and include an informative session title and a short description of the session (see details below). Session presentations will be oral, poster, or both, to be determined by the Planning Committee after abstracts have been received. As a note, we strongly encourage proposals for 'poster-only' sessions. Poster sessions will be designed for maximum attendance and will not conflict with oral presentations. We are also looking at creative ways to allow electronic poster presentations.

Guidelines for Session Proposal Submissions: At least two co-chairs that plan to attend the meeting are required. Session titles should be between 45 to 180 characters. Session descriptions should be limited to 200 words and should be broad enough to include all interested researchers, regardless of affiliation or funding sources.

Schedule: Session proposals must be submitted online by 23:59 U.S. Central Daylight Time, 30 September, 2009. The Call for Abstracts will be issued Fall 2009. Abstracts will be due online 12 February 2010, when an abstract fee and registration for the conference will be required.

Oral Session Format: Oral sessions will be consist of 15-min talks. Invited presenters are required to submit an abstract and pay abstract and registration fees. Sessions will be scheduled by the Planning Committee after abstracts have been received.

Poster Session Format: Posters will be approximately 4'x4' or 122cmx122cm. Posters will be grouped by topic for two hours at a time when no oral sessions are scheduled. Beverages and snacks will be available during poster sessions.

# Background

The Sir Alister Hardy Foundation for Ocean Science (SAHFOS) is a UK registered international charity responsible for managing the Continuous Plankton Recorder (CPR) Survey. Since 1931, the Survey's monitoring programme has collected epipelagic plankton using CPRs, towed by volunteer merchant 'ships of opportunity', on regular monthly shipping routes in North Atlantic and North Sea. In recent years the Survey has expanded into the North Pacific and Antarctic Oceans and in future is likely to extend to the Arctic Ocean, Baltic and Mediterranean Seas. The unique dataset of plankton biodiversity, created from these tows, is temporally and spatially the most extensive in the world. It provides a wide range of environmental and climatic indicators and is used throughout the world by marine scientists and policy makers to address marine environmental management issues such as harmful algal blooms, biodiversity, pollution, eutrophication, climate change and fisheries.

SAHFOS was established in 1990 and is funded by the UK government and a consortium of agencies from a number of countries. The Foundation is governed by a Council of Management and by the Director, Professor Peter Burkill. SAHFOS is based in Plymouth overlooking Plymouth Sound.

SAHFOS is looking for one full-time or two part-time plankton analysts to join a small dedicated team of marine parataxonomists in carrying out the microscopic analysis of plankton samples fixed in formalin. Preference will be given to candidates who have experience or an interest in plankton taxonomy and identification and a minimum of A levels in Science; however full training will be given. Hours of employment for the post(s) are 37 and 20 per week respectively.

## Job Purpose

The purpose of the job is to:

- \* The identification and enumeration, using a microscope, of phytoplankton and zooplankton in samples collected by the CPR survey.
- \* To perform routine laboratory duties as part of a small team operating the Continuous Plankton Recorder survey. These will include:
- · The preparation of samples for analysis
- Update the database by data entry and manipulation using a computer
- · Preparation of preservation chemicals
- Maintain an up to date filing system
- · Aid in the curation and cataloguing of samples through the curation programme
