This will be the final webinar of 2022. A big Thank You to all the contributors so far!


The webinar series will start again on 2nd February 2023.

Nostalgia for Marine Biologists

Many members of ECSA, particularly those of us who are no longer in our first flush of youth, will have spent time either at or working with the Port Erin Marine Laboratory on the Isle of Man. From a modest beginning by Victorian Naturalists it grew to become one of the foremost institutions dedicated to Marine Science. For many years it came under effective control of Liverpool University, and it was their precipitous withdrawal of funding which led to its closure in 2006 – a decision which still seems to defy logic. 16 years on the buildings still stand unused and increasingly derelict.

In the autumn of 2022, an exhibition was held on the Island to commemorate the 130th anniversary of its foundation. In connection with this a book was published with a potted history of the lab, its achievements and some of the characters associated with it over the years. It cannot fail to bring back memories to anyone who ever worked at the laboratory.

The 2023 programme will include six sessions across two days, covering the major themes which over 400 past delegates have voted for. This year a livestream of the conference will also be offered to engage a wider audience than ever before.
